NILOUFAR SHIRI is a graduate of the Tehran Music School. She received her diploma on Kamancheh. Since 2004, she has been studying Kamancheh under the supervision of Maestro Saeed Farajpour. Since 2011, she has been studying and researching classical Persian music theory under the direction and supervision of Dr. Hossein Omoumi, Professor of Music at the UCI. Currently, she is pursuing her bachelor in Music Composition from UCSD.

EBRAHIM POUSTINCHI is an Architect, Designer, Composer and Tar player. Ebrahim has completed his postgraduate studies in Architecture, at UCLA, while he developed his multicultural vision, through form, typography, music and Architecture. He has been playing in several ensembles in Iran, focusing on contemporary understanding of classical Persian music.
