Originally born in Manhattan, NY and then moving to Pennsylvania shortly after, most of his musical background stems from his parents who were both musical theater performers, with his dad spending ten years on the Broadway Theater stage in the production of Miss Saigon. Colin has played leading roles in shows including Footloose, Oklahoma, and George M. Cohen and has performed with various vocal music groups including a nationally competitive gospel choir known as Urbane, and won a competition to sing backup on the song "I Wanna Know What Love Is" with the famous rock band Foreigner during their national tour, when they passed through Pennsylvania. He studied voice with Mistro Peter Mark from the Virginia Opera company and performed in the choruses, with a few minor roles, in professional productions of Porgy and Bess, La Traviatta, and Carmen. He also studied musical theater performance along with arranging and performing instrumentally with renowned Broadway composers and pianists Mark Janas and Jimmy Roberts. He won the senior vocal award along with a \$500 prize for his performance of "Empty Chairs at Empty Tables" at the Sherman Theater in Stroudsburg, Pennsylvania in 2010. In the same year he was also first chair in the tenor 1 section for the PMEA District and Regional chorus festivals. Since starting college, Colin's focus has evolved from performing to composing music, although he still works as the music director and primary arranger of the on-campus all-male acapella group Frequency. His love and fascination with sound continues to grow with every new composition, whether it be vocal, orchestral, or even electronic.
